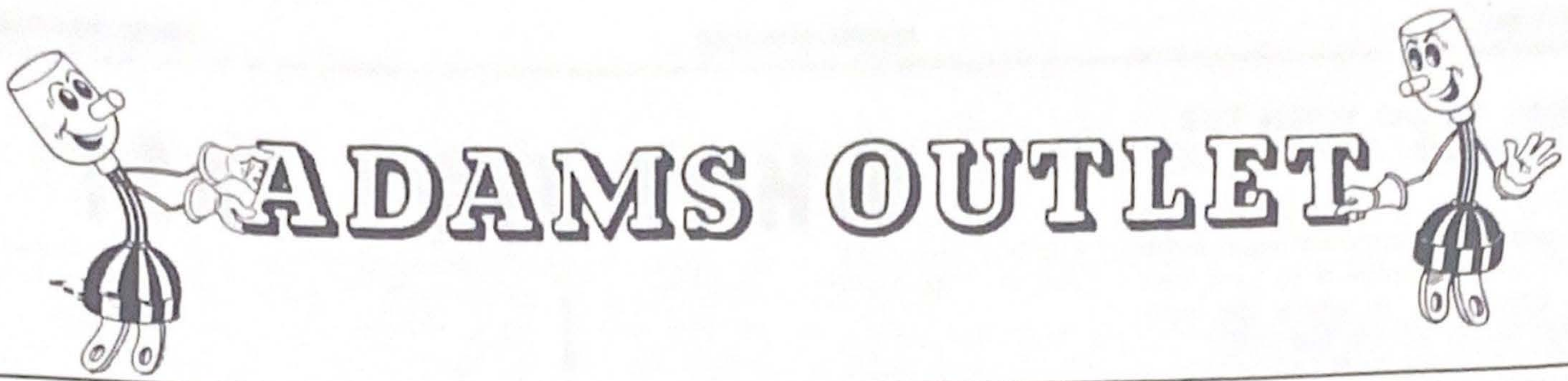
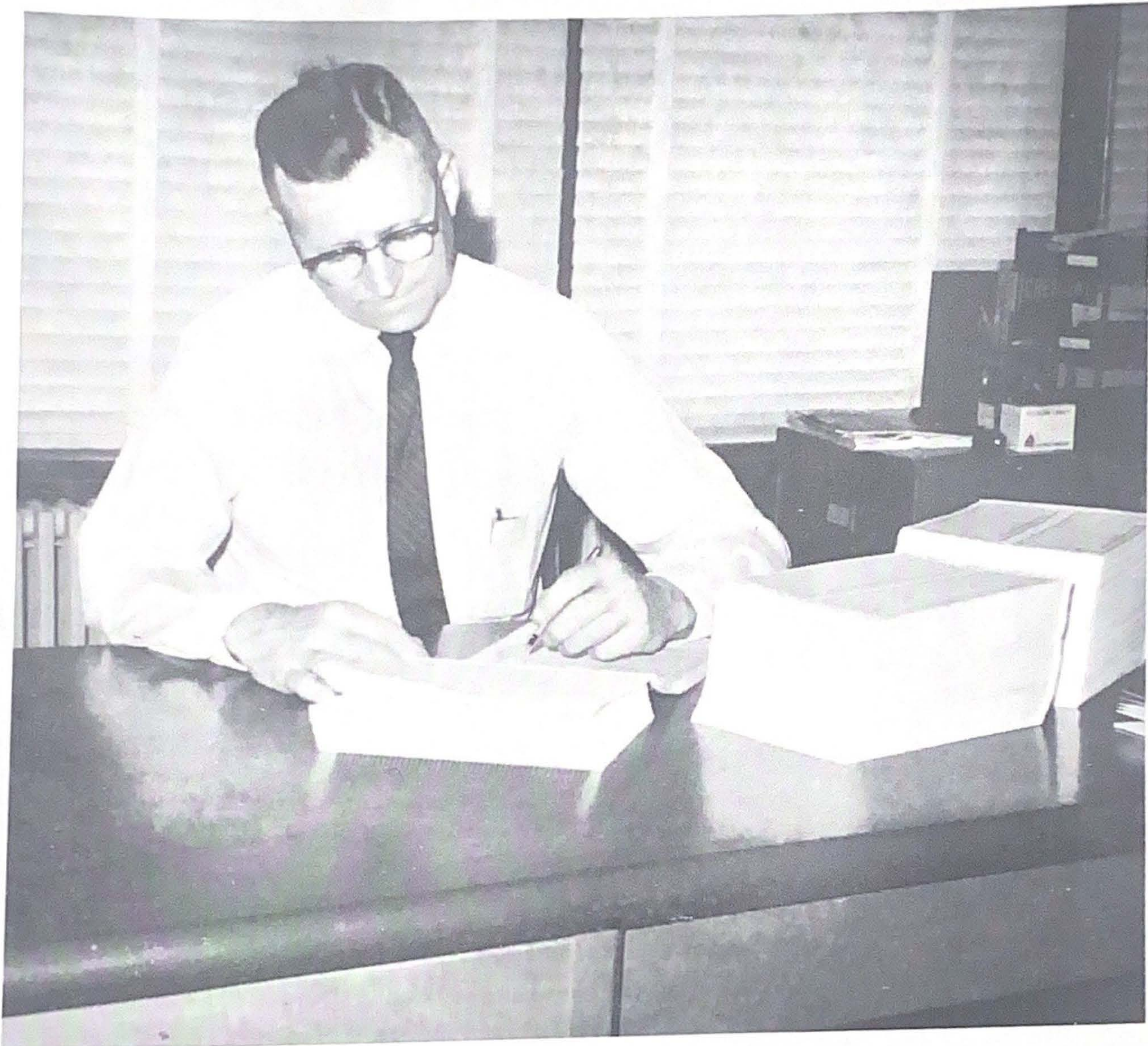

WHAT TO DO WHEN THE POWER IS OFF

1. Check your fuses and switches below meter. If some of your lights work, then the trouble is in your own fuses. Remember to check the main cartridge fuses in the fuse box.
2. If all the lights are off, then check with your neighbor to see if his power is off.
3. If you have not found the trouble, call the appropriate number listed below. Be sure to give your name, location and map number which is to the right of your name on the address side of the billing card. This map number is used the same as a street address in locating your place. Please call in as soon as the trouble is discovered or anything wrong with the line is noticed.
4. For Service Outages — call the following:

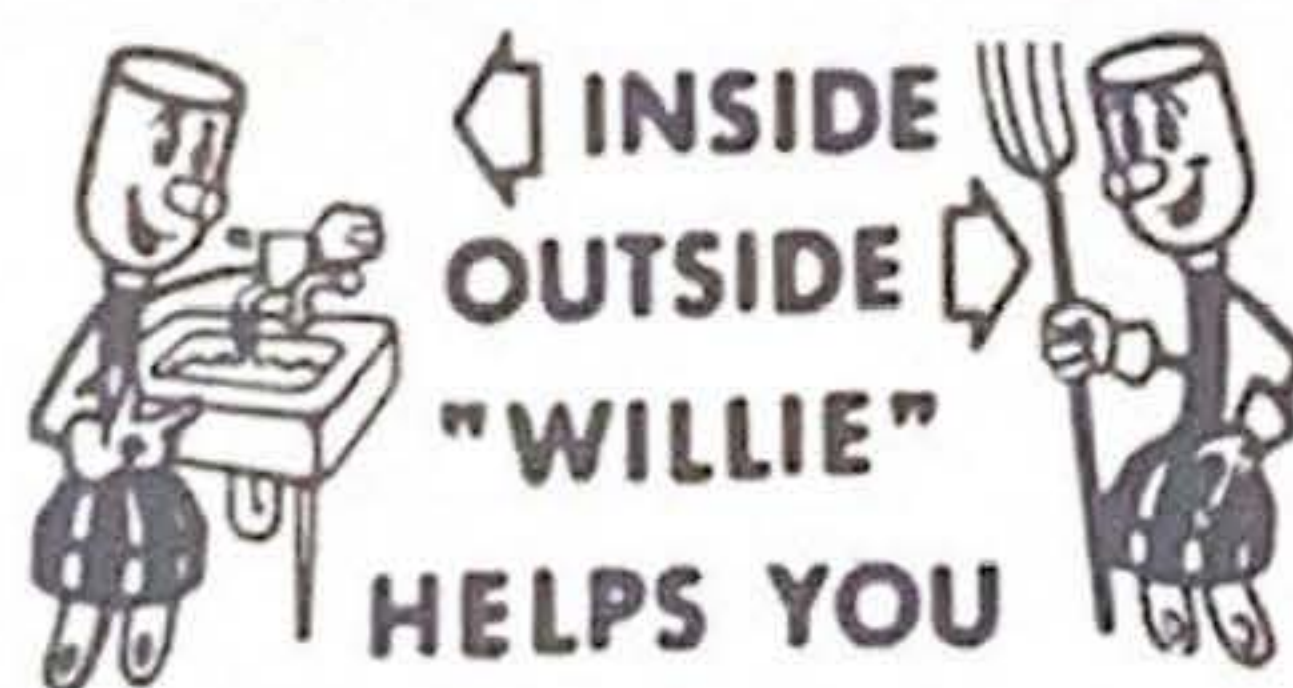

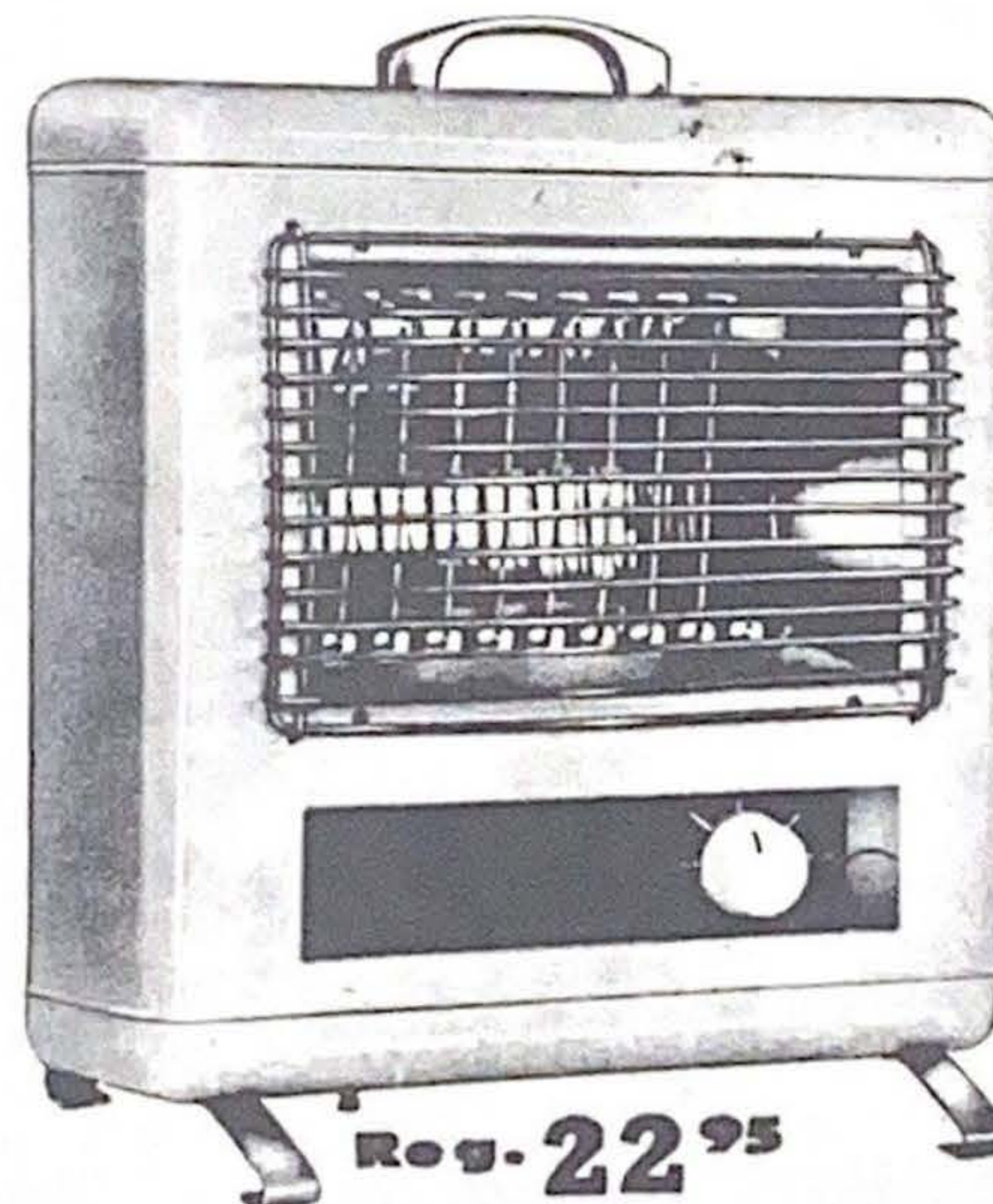

1947-1954 Capital Credits To Be Distributed Next Month

Adams Electrical Co-operative members will soon be receiving over one quarter million dollars in capital credits. Approximately 7,000 capital credit checks will be mailed from your Co-operative next month. Altogether \$270,000 will be repaid to those members who received electric service during the years 1947 thru 1954. The size of the checks will vary from small amounts up to several hundred dollars. The amount of capital credit earned is in proportion to the amount of electricity used during that period.

The payment of capital credits indicates one of the great differences between a co-operative and an investor owned company. In a co-operative such as Adams Electrical, all revenue above cost of rendering service (capital credits) is returned to the members (who are the users of the service). These capital credits are paid in proportion to their use of electric service. In an investor owned company this revenue is paid in the form of dividends to

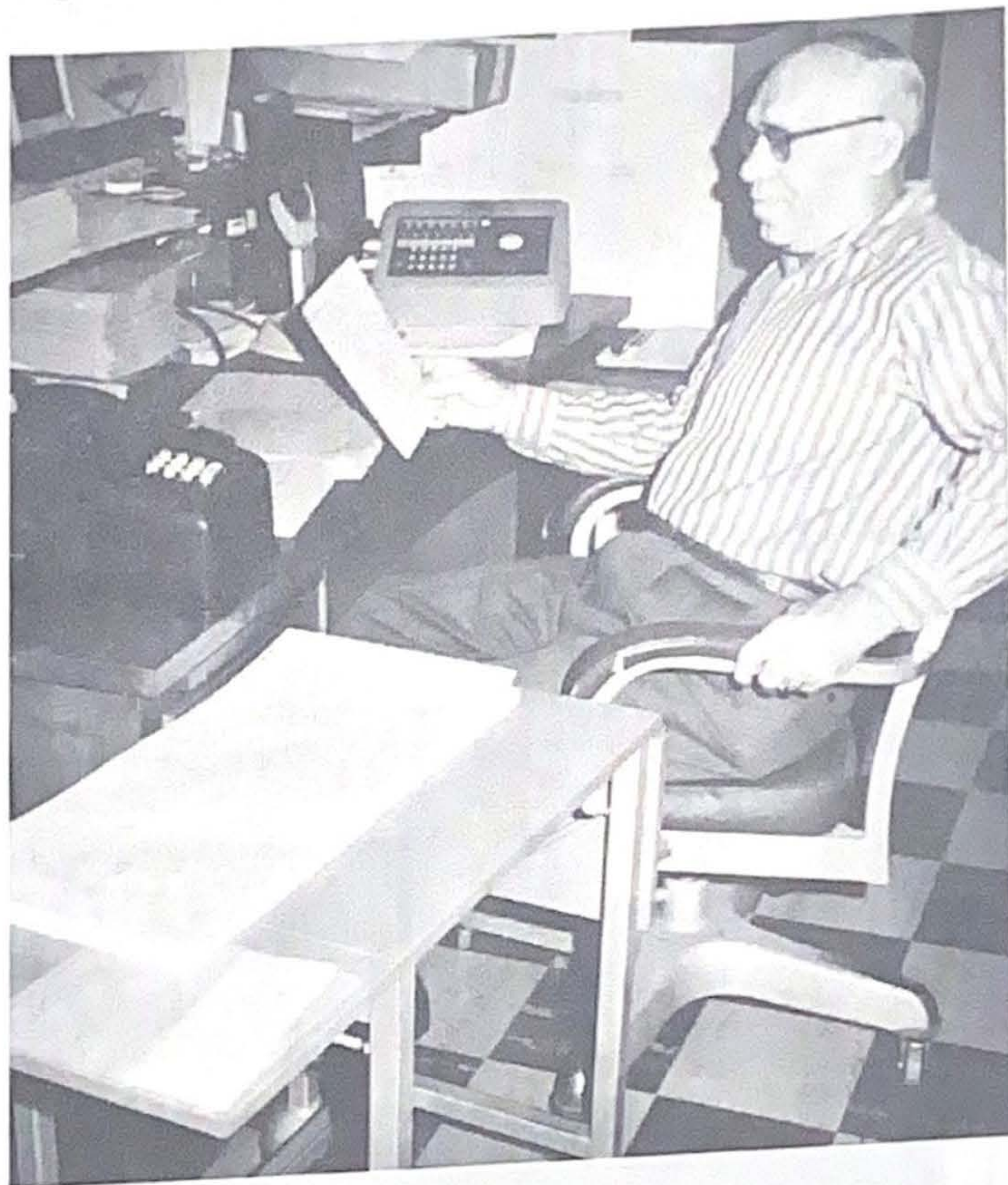
the stockholders in proportion to the amount of capital they have invested.

The amount of capital credits earned varies each year, depending on cost of operating your electric system. During the early years of operation between 1939 through 1946 the consumption of electricity was quite low and cost of operations was large and no capital credits were earned. The paying of capital credits is not an annual occurrence with your electric co-operative, but based up on its financial condition.

Your capital credits is another financial bonus for making full use of your electric co-operatives services by going "All Electric."

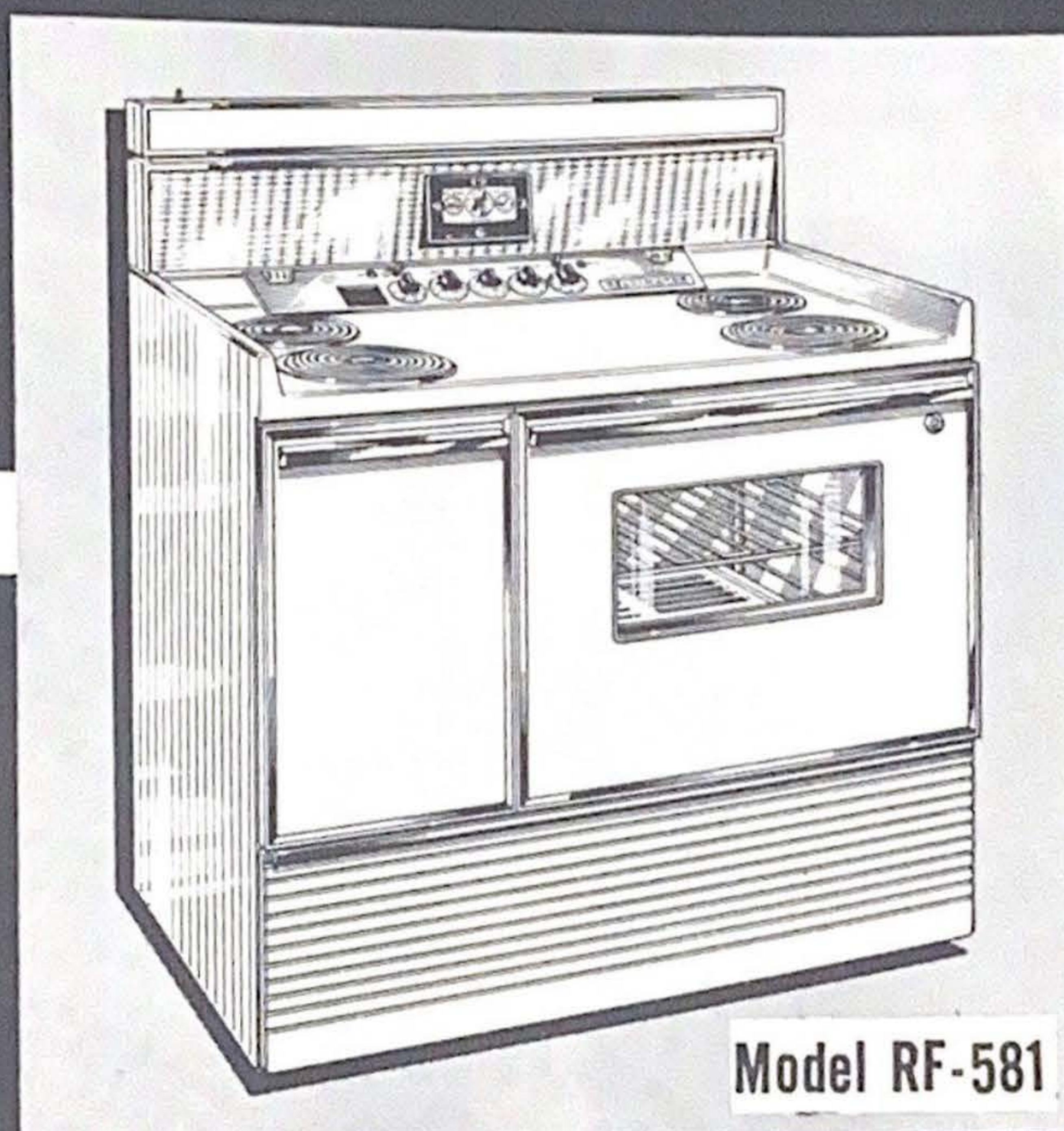
WHAT MUST I DO TO ENTER CONTEST?

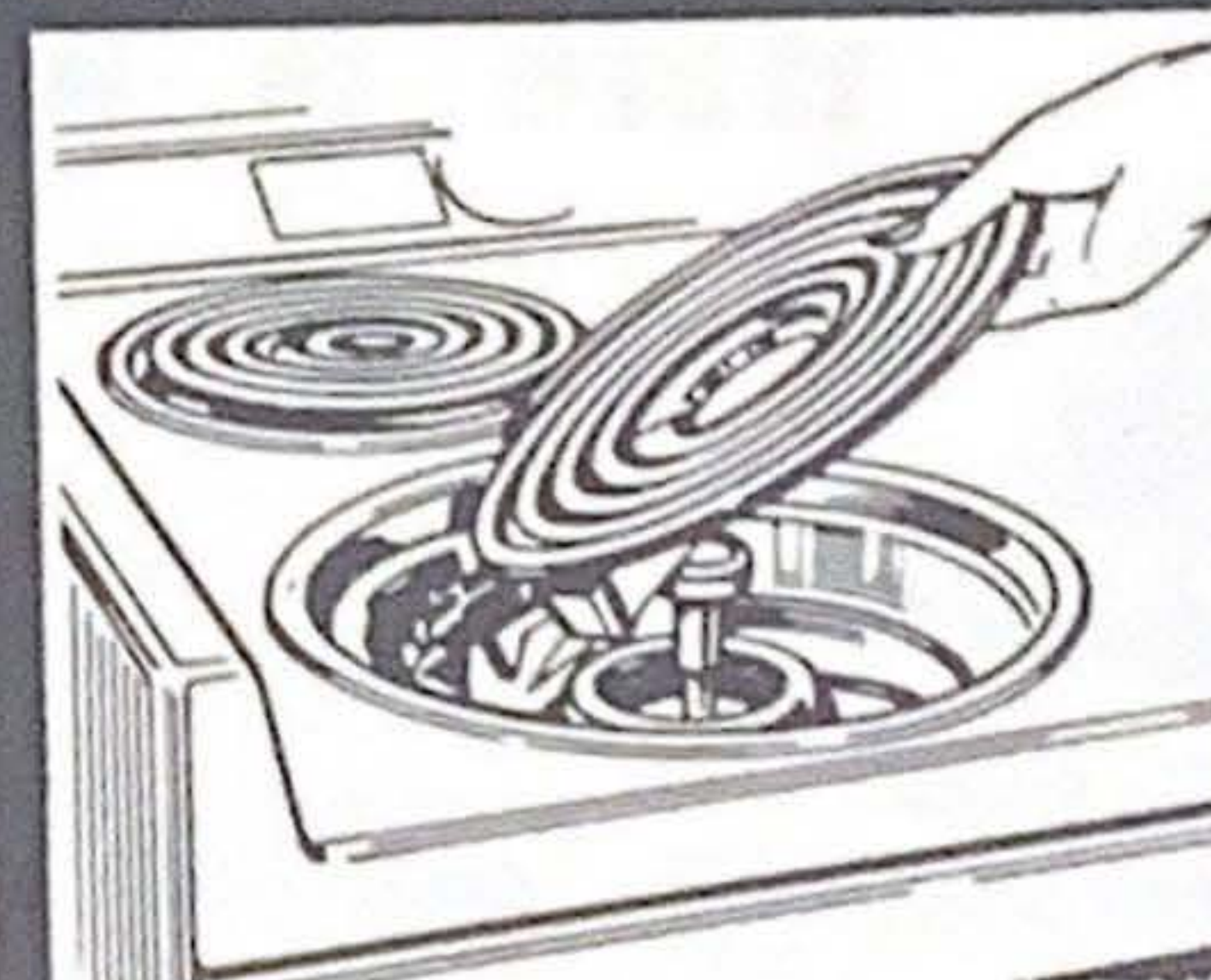

BROWN COUNTY 4-H ELECTRIC SCHOOL

The Brown County 4-H Electric Project school started on January 7, and continued on consecutive Monday nights through Feb. 4th. The Feb. 4th meeting was family night and those taking the project entertained with 4-H electric demonstrations. Refreshments were served at each meeting. This year 22 boys enrolled in the project and the school was under the direction of Robert Hayward, Brown County Farm Adviser; with Roger Mohrman and G. A. Moody of Adams Electrical Co-operative and Roger Baker of CIPS Co. furnishing the instruction.

First year enrollees learned fundamentals of electricity and worked on test lamps and extension cords. Second year 4-H'ers wired single pole and three-way switches; built test panel and studied motors. Boys in the advanced group worked with a controls kit furnished by the U. of I. Electrical safety was stressed throughout the school.

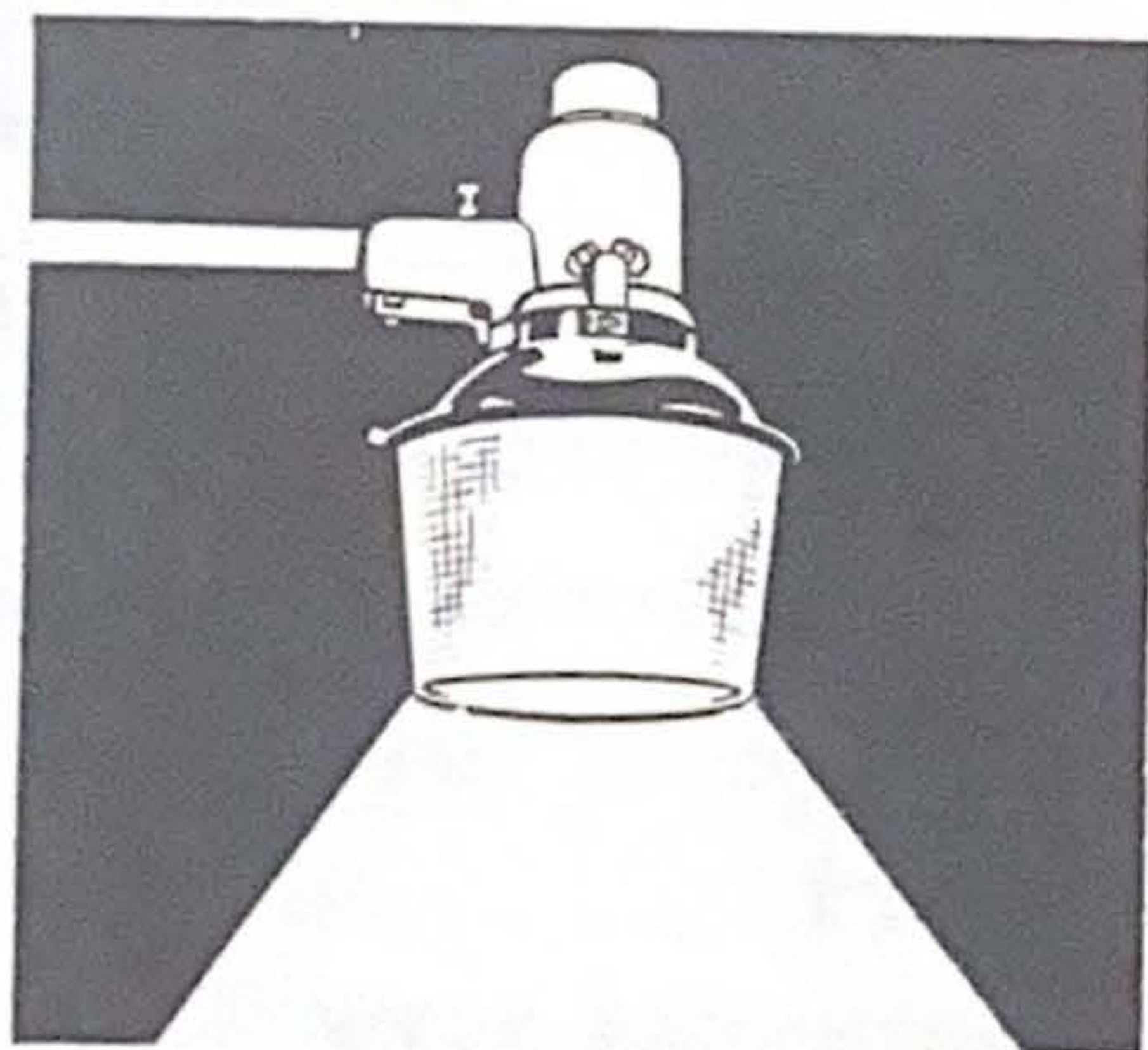


Aubrey Bucher

NEW SECURITY LIGHTING PROGRAM OFFERS 15% MORE LIGHT FOR THE SAME LOW COST



Your co-operative has adopted a new security lighting policy which will offer more light for the same low \$3.00 per month rental. All future security lights will use the mercury vapor bulb instead of the incandescent type. These recently improved bulbs will give approximately 15% more light. The fixtures will look similar to the old style and will still automatically provide dusk till dawn lighting. The present users of security lights will have their fixtures converted to the improved type bulb as servicemen are in their area. Now is the time to plan your installation.
