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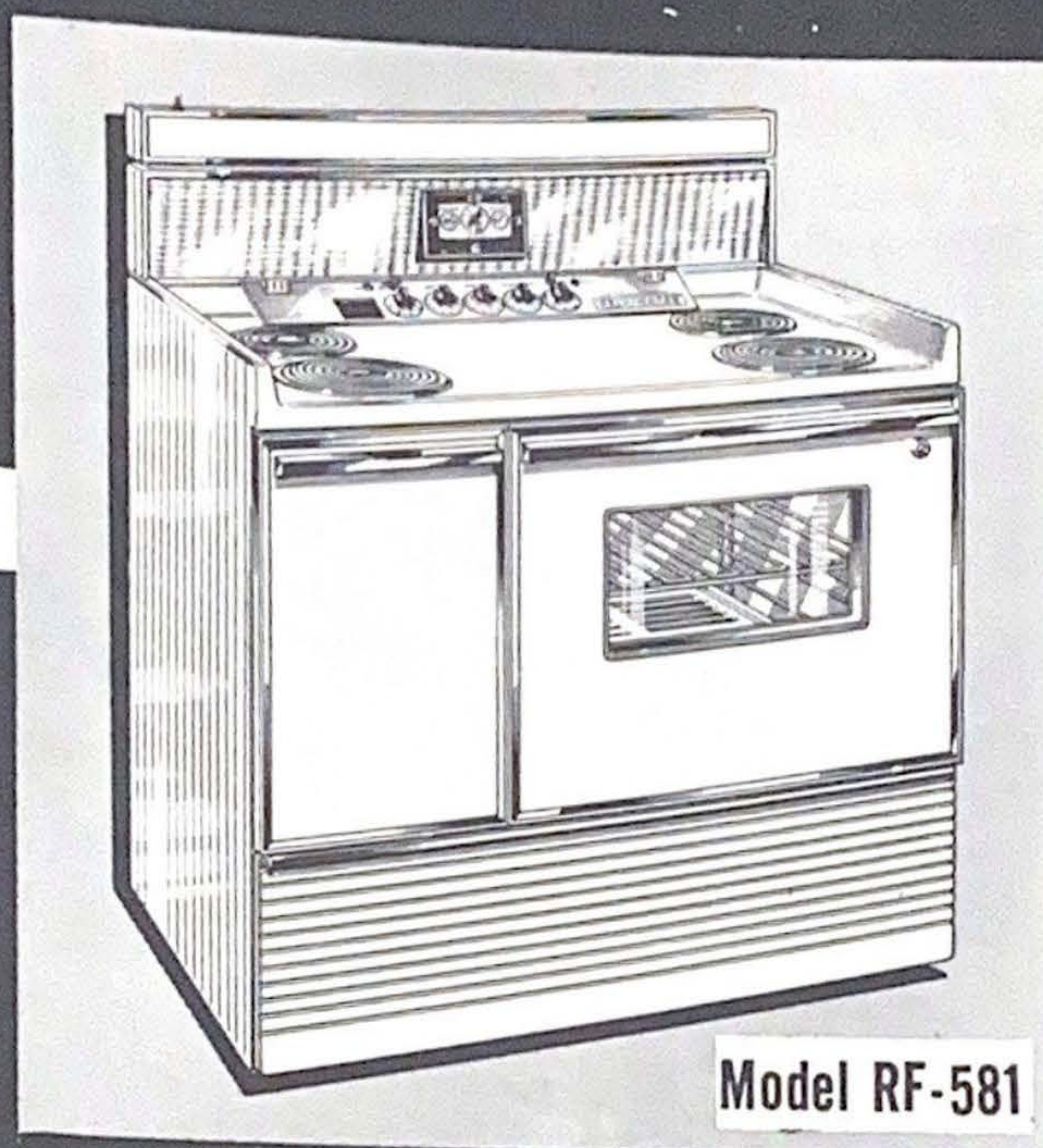

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\$270,000 In Capital Credit Checks Mailed To Members

Directors Present Checks to various members and organizations representing each service area

Adams Electrical Co-operative recently mailed to its members over one quarter million dollars in capital credits. Approximately 7,000 checks were mailed to members who had received electric service from the co-operative during the years 1947 thru 1954. The checks varied from small amounts to several hundred dollars. The amount of capital credit earned was figured in proportion to the amount of electricity used during that period. Those members who were "all electric" during that period naturally received larger capital credit checks.

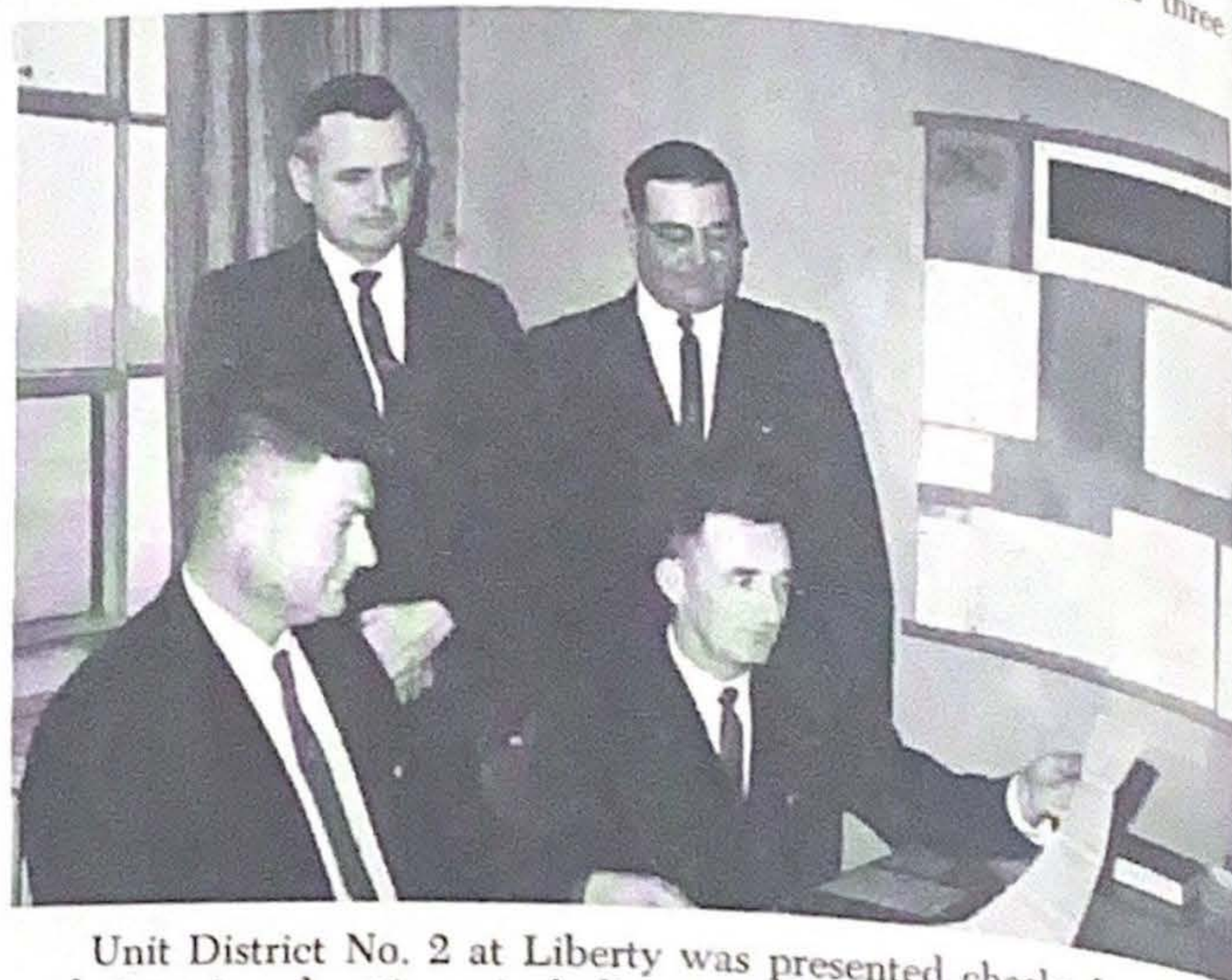
On this and the succeeding page are pictures of Adams Electrical Co-operative Directors presenting checks to members who for one reason or another are representative of the total membership of the co-operative.

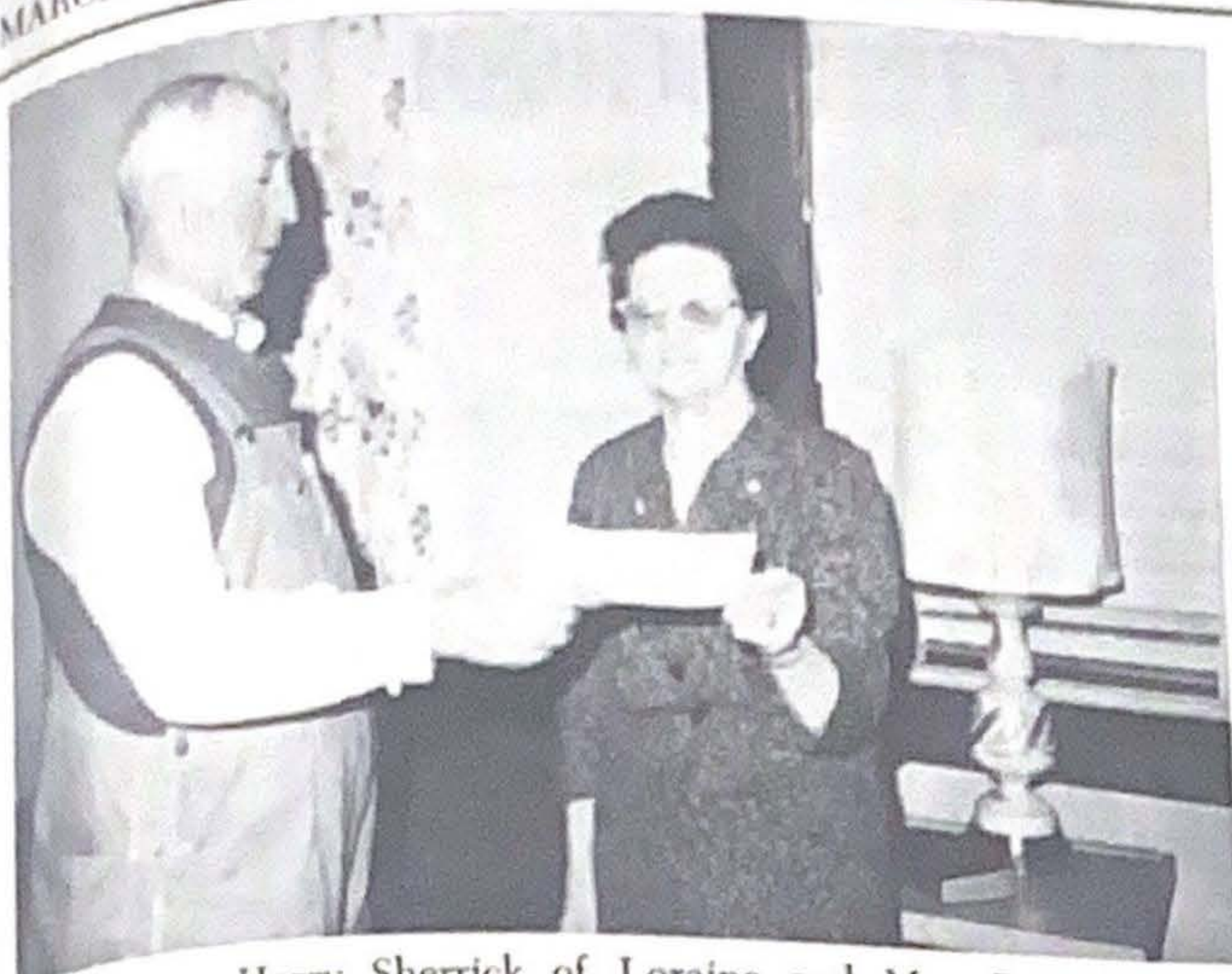

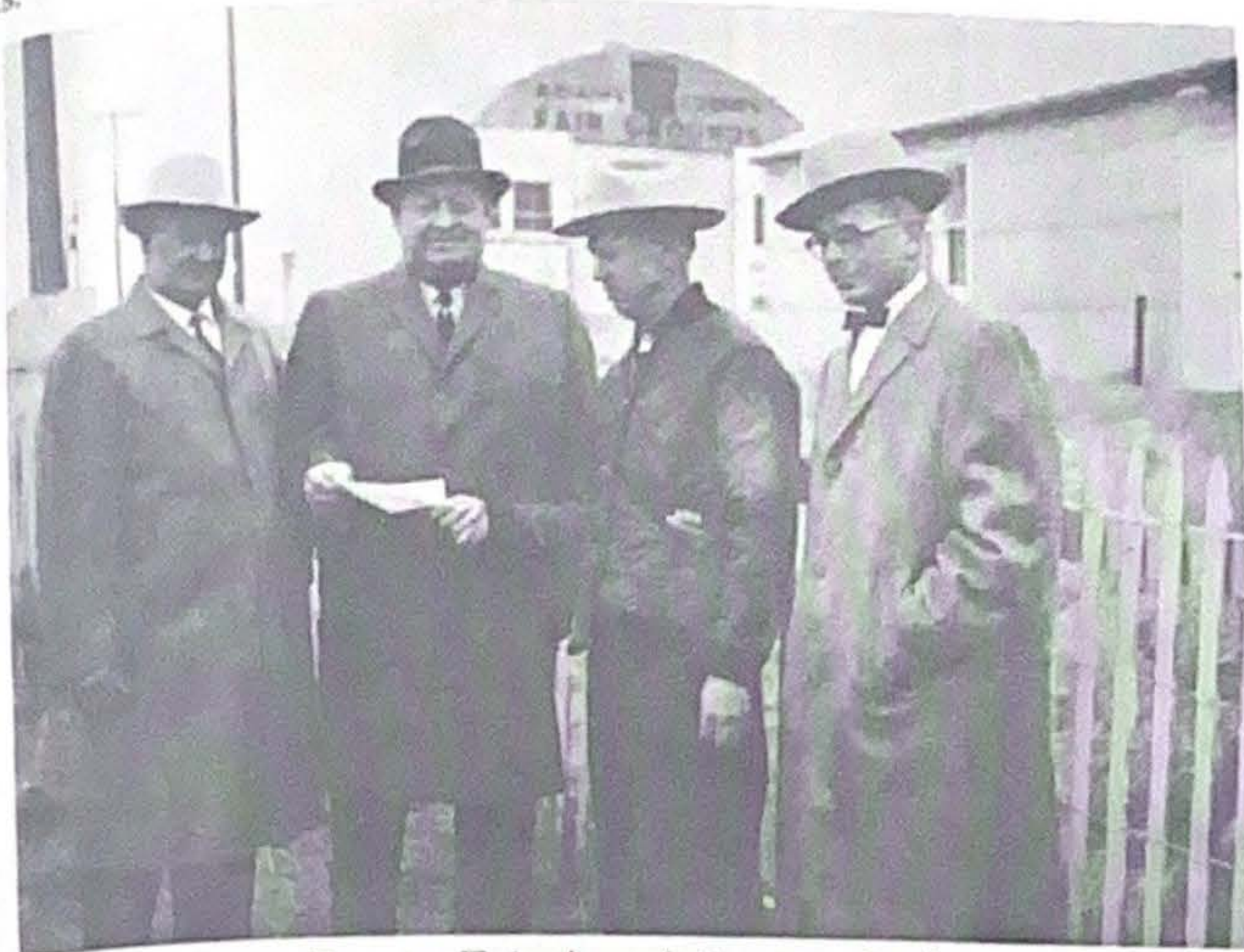
CAPITAL CREDITS — — YOUR BONUS FOR GOING "ALL ELECTRIC"

ADAMS COUNTY 4-H ELECTRIC SCHOOL

The Adams County 4-H Electric Project school started on February 11th and continued on consecutive Monday nights through February 25th. An additional meeting, a tour of two farms making good use of electric service, was held on March 4th. The farms toured belong to Robert and Walter Thompson by the Quincy airport, and we sincerely thank them for their hospitality. This year 52 boys enrolled in the project and the school was under the direction of Ron Dedert, assistant Adams County Farm Adviser, with Roger Mohrman and G. A. Moody of Adams

Electrical Co-operative and Everett Shoopman and Virgil Perry of C.I.P.S. Co. furnishing the instruction.

First year enrollees learned fundamentals of electricity and worked on test lamps and extension cords. Second year 4-H'ers wired single pole and three-way switches; built test panels and studied motors. Boys in the advanced group worked with a controls kit furnished by the U. of I. Electrical safety was stressed throughout the school.

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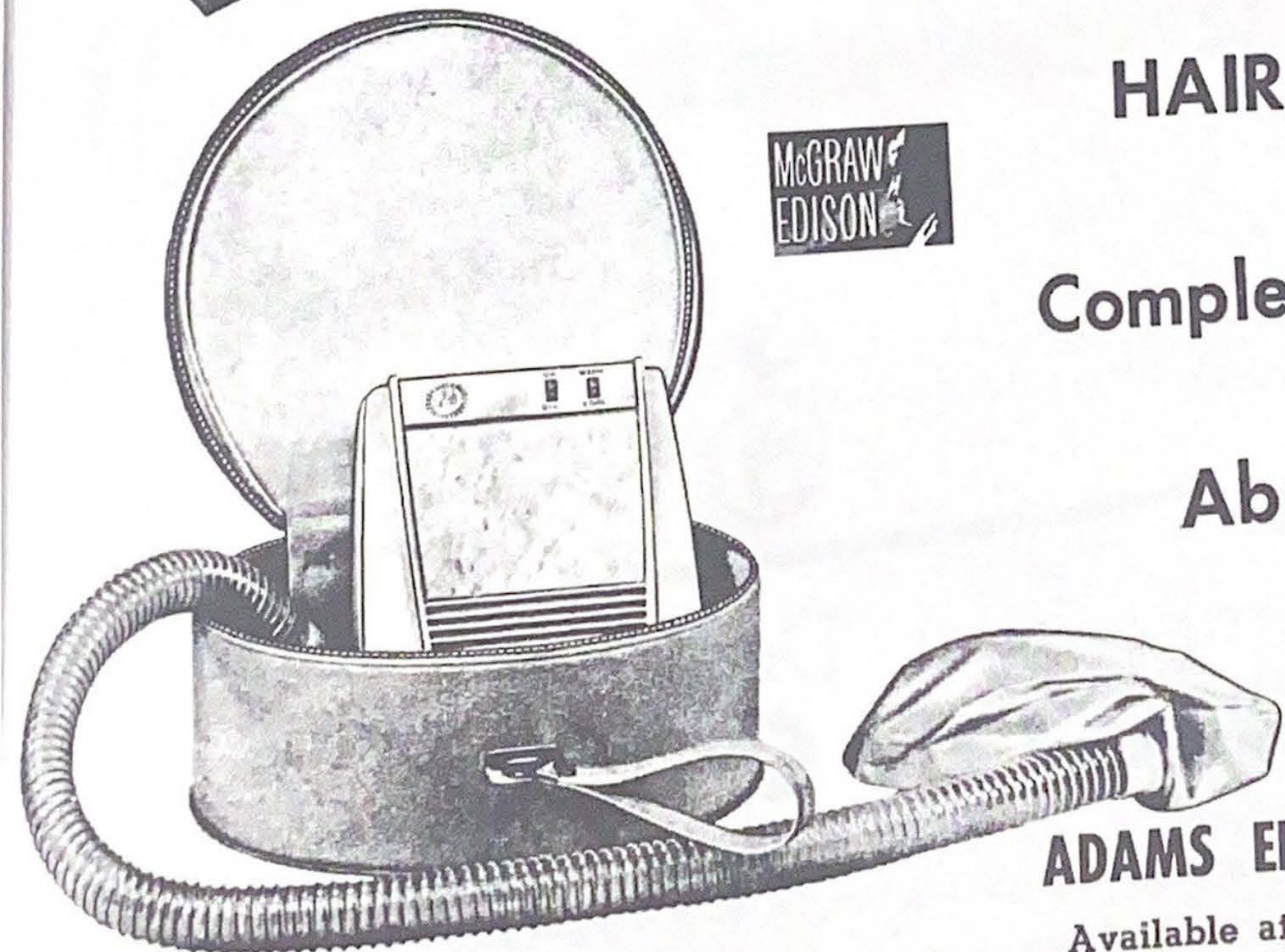
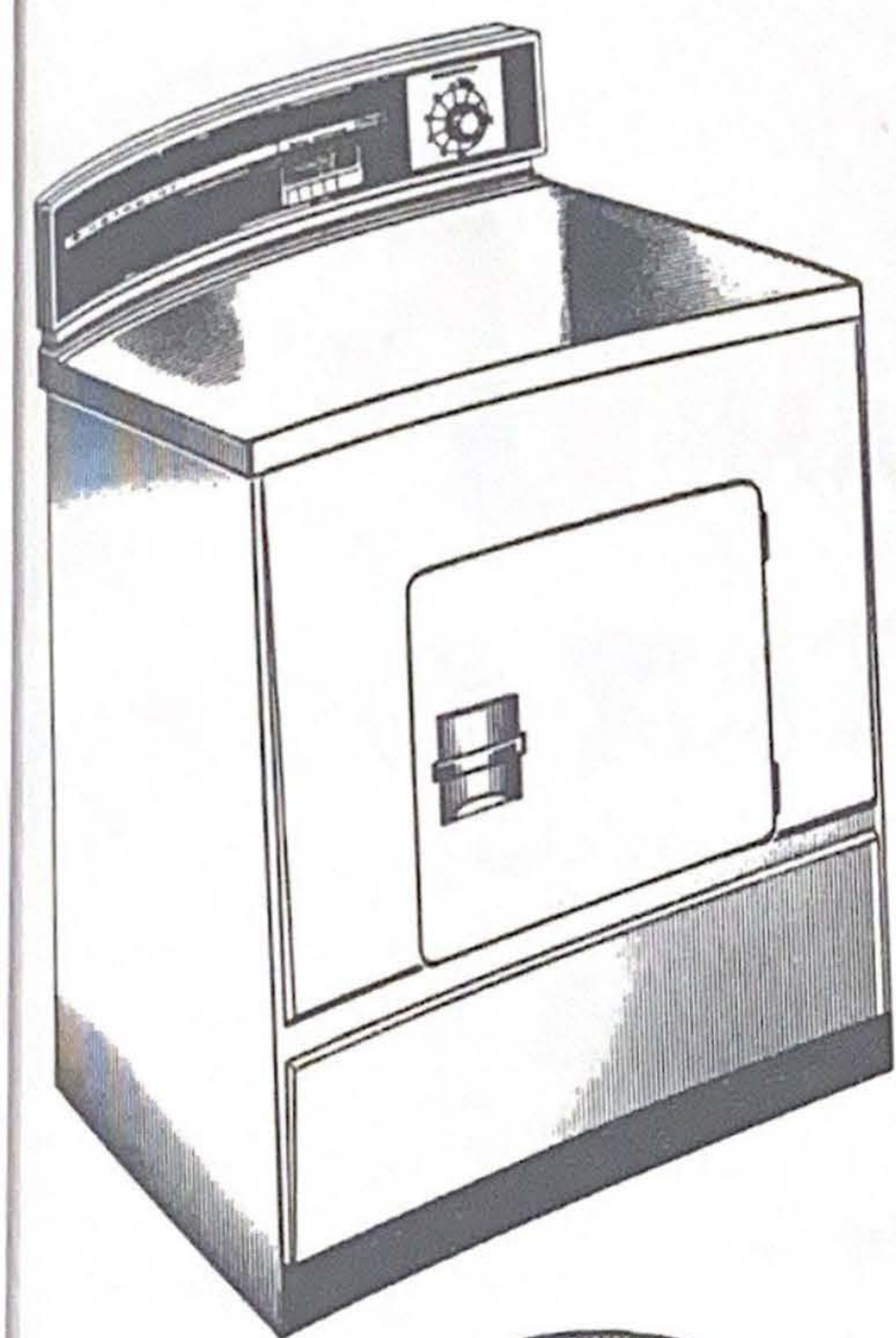
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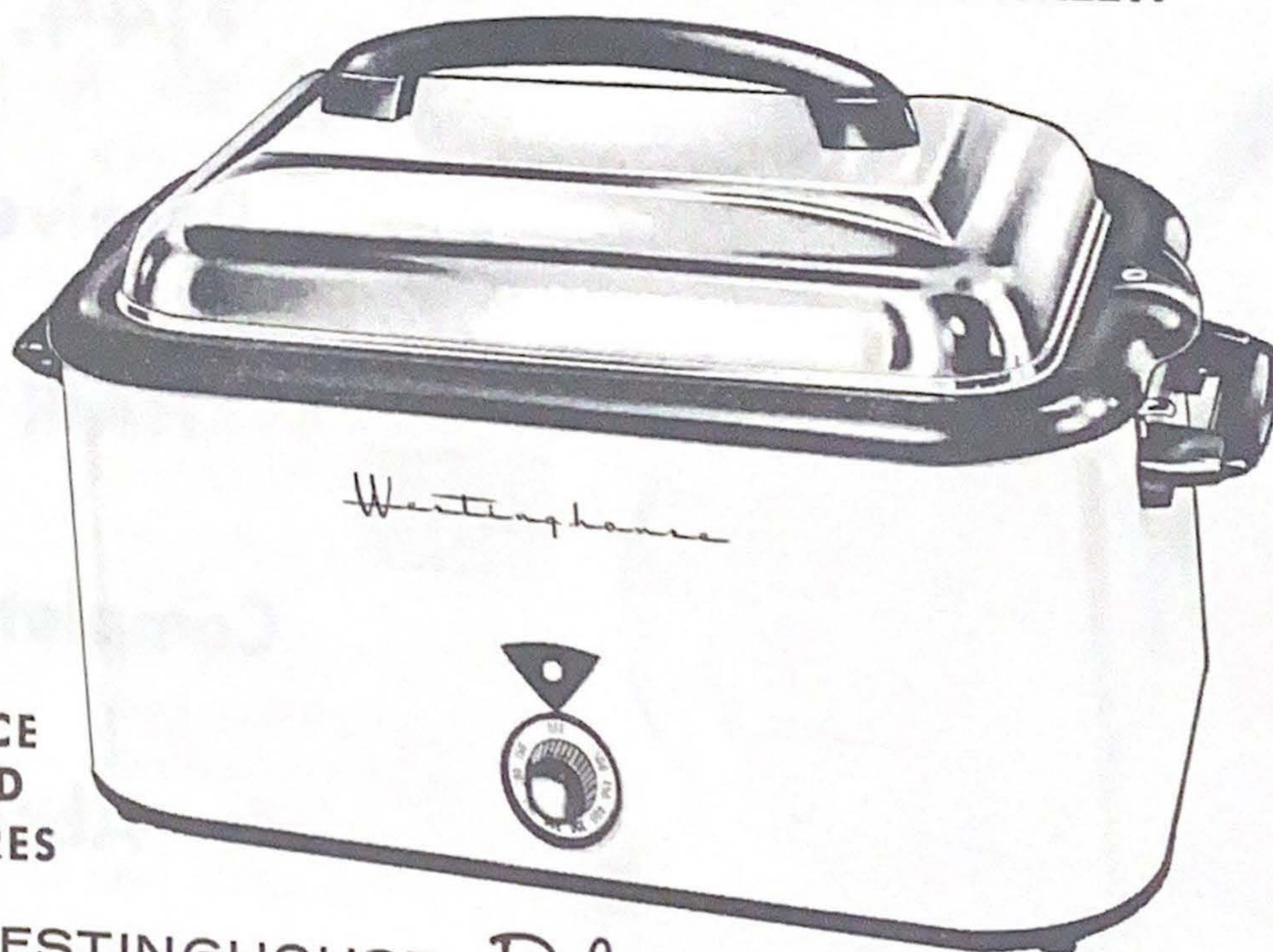


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
