ARE HOME ELECTRONICS AND APPLIANCES DRAINING YOUR ENERGY?

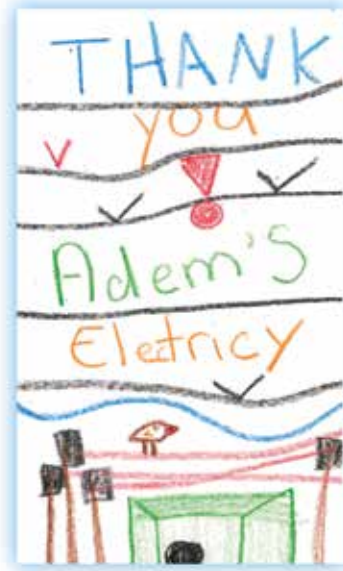
If you collect your spare change in a jar, all those coins add up over time, usually to a larger amount than you expect.

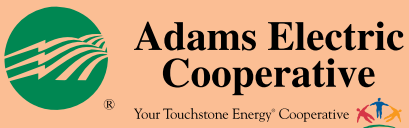

Celebrating the Cooperative's 85th Annual Meeting

On Wednesday, September 3, members of the Cooperative gathered at Bailey Park to celebrate the organization's 85th Annual Meeting. This year's meeting was back to the picnic-style format, creating a relaxed and welcoming atmosphere for all attendees. Despite a brief shower towards the end of the business portion, the weather cooperated, and everyone's spirits remained high.

Food and Entertainment

Attendees enjoyed approximately 1,100 pork chop sandwiches, prepared by the Butcher Block. The event featured musical entertainment from the York Street Jazz Orchestra, whose performance received enthusiastic feedback from members who appreciated the music.

Activities and Vendor Displays

The meeting offered a variety of activities for children, including two bounce houses, ring toss, face painting, and shaved ice. Several vendor displays were available for members to explore, adding to the engaging and family-friendly environment.

PENNY POWER Grants Awarded

Twelve Penny Power grant applications were approved for funding during the July grant cycle. A total of **\$9,017.84** was granted to the following groups/organizations:

- **\$1,000** - Brown County Schools Special Ed.; emotional disorder and behavioral deficit program

- **\$1,350** - Jackson-Lincoln Swimming Complex; pool safety and cleaning equipment
- **\$507.84** - Lincoln-Douglas Ron Clark Academy House; Family Engagement Block Party
- **\$800** - YMCA of West Central IL; two iPad Mini devices used by staff and students

8 Ways to Pay Your Bill

1. Pay Online

Set up your account on our website, pay online, view your usage and billing history.

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2. Automatic Bank Drafting

Pay your electric bill automatically from your checking account. You must have a good payment record to qualify.

3. E-Check (Electronic Check)

An E-Check is a one-time payment from your checking account.

4. Credit Card

We accept MasterCard, Visa and Discover. Pay month by month or set up a recurring credit card payment.



5. Budget Billing

A budget billing plan, designed to equalize monthly electric payments, is available. You must have a good payment record and be a member for at least one year.



6. Drop Box

Payment of your electric bill may be made at the Camp Point office's 24-hour drop box.

7. By Mail

You may mail your payment to our office at: Adams Electric Cooperative, P.O. Box 247, Camp Point, IL 62320

8. In Person

Our office hours are Monday-Friday from 7:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

85th Annual Meeting

Weather forecasting is always a challenge when planning a major outdoor event. Given the extensive preparation involved in organizing the Annual Meeting, relocating the venue requires significant last-minute adjustments. This year, we moved forward with Bailey Park as planned. Aside from a few light sprinkles and some rain during the door prize segment, we were fortunate with the weather. The ideal temperature contributed to an excellent turnout and a well-attended event.

Registered memberships totaled 402. About 1,100 pork chop sandwich meals were served. Apprentice Linemen Dustin Waddell and Grady Kurfman demonstrated pole climbing and let kids spin a wheel for prizes and take pictures with the lineman photo props. The York Street Jazz Orchestra was likely the last group to perform in the large shelter house. (The shelter house is scheduled to be torn down and rebuilt before our next picnic style meeting.) Vendors lined the tent including a few new ones: Hickory Point Farms,

Coatsburg Lions Club, WIC, and Your Local Plant Dealer among many others. Some of our advertisers were also represented: Area Home Services, Bower & Associates, Edward Jones, and Timber Point Healthcare. Eric Ewing of Rushville, Brent Clair of Loraine, and Laura Meyer of Liberty were re-elected to the Cooperative's board of directors. Members who updated their contact information at the meeting were in a drawing for a \$250 electric bill credit. The winner of this drawing was: Cleo Powers of Payson.

Manager of Communications Laura Bergman introduced Jamen Tchabda of Quincy Notre Dame to say a few words about her trip to Washington, D.C. as a Youth Tour winner. Bergman also recognized Garrett Neisen, the recipient of the LaVern and Nola McEntire Lineman's Scholarship.

During the meeting, Manager of Marketing & Member Services Bill Stalder thanked members on the Co-op's Advisory Committee for their commitment. Stalder introduced Directors Rex Niekamp and Brent Clair to present a \$1,500 Penny Power check to Adams County Fair Association for their drainage system project. A total of \$712,207.36 has been distributed since the program began over 20 years ago!

Board President Laura Meyer emphasized Adams Electric's commitment to community. She highlighted safety initiatives, education programs, and

renewable energy projects, including two wind turbines and a new solar project planned in Schuyler County supported by a federal grant.

and secures the remainder of its capacity needs through power purchase agreements and bilateral contracts, members were shielded from the recent capacity auction. A video of Prairie State generation facility was shared with the members. This facility provides approximately 60% of

Adams Electric's energy needs and 41% of its capacity needs. To conclude the meeting, Manager Thompson thanked members for their attendance and drew for door prizes. Three grand prizes, \$250 electric bill credits, were awarded from Adams Electric. Grand prize winners were Charles Taylor of Quincy, Ben Myers of Quincy, and James Fox of Fowler. Thank you to all those who attended. **Make plans now to attend next year's Annual Meeting on Wednesday, September 9, 2025. Next year will be a drive through event, either in Brown or Schuyler County!**

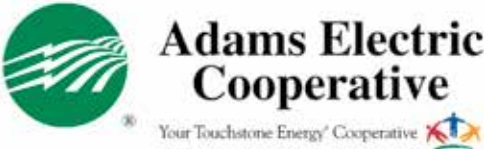

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Electricity and water don't mix. Power equipment can catch fire due to an insulator failure, trees in lines, lightning strikes or other conditions. If you see a pole, power lines, or other utility equipment on fire, do not attempt to put it out. Water can create a path to ground causing serious injury or death. Electrical fires can also cause injury due to an arc flash.

Instead, evacuate the area, keep others back, and call 911. The utility will shut off power for firefighters to put the fire out safely.

Pumpkin Crunch Cake

Pumpkin Crunch Cake

1 can (15 oz.) pumpkin
1 can (12 oz.) evaporated milk
3 lg. eggs
1 1/2 cups sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. salt
1 box yellow cake mix
1 cup pecans, chopped
1 cup butter, melted
Cool Whip

Preheat oven to 350°F. Combine pumpkin, evaporated milk, eggs, sugar, cinnamon, and salt in a large bowl or mixer. Pour the pumpkin mixture into greased 13x9 baking dish. Run cake mix through a sifter to get out any lumps and sprinkle the dry cake mix evenly over the pumpkin mixture. Top with chopped pecans. Drizzle melted butter over pecans. Bake for 50-55 minutes until top is golden brown. Allow cake to cool. Serve chilled (or warm) with whipped topping.

Cream Cheese Cookies

1 cup butter
1 (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened
1 cup sugar
1/4 tsp. salt
1 tsp. vanilla
1 egg
2 Tbsp. milk
2 cups flour, sifted
1/4 cup chopped walnuts

(Cream Cheese Cookies continued)

Preheat oven to 325°F. Beat butter, cream cheese, sugar, salt and vanilla until fluffy. Add egg and milk; mix well. Gradually add flour. Stir in walnuts. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto lightly greased cookie sheet about 2 inches apart. Bake for 20 minutes. Remove to wire rack to cool. Makes 5 dozen.

Pumpkin Torte

1st Layer:
12 whole Honey Graham Crackers, crushed
1/2 cup butter
1/3 cup sugar

2nd Layer:
2 eggs
3/4 cup sugar
8 oz. cream cheese, softened

3rd Layer:
2 cups (1 can) pumpkin
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 cup milk
3/4 cup sugar, divided
3 egg yolks, separate yolks and whites
1 Tbsp. cinnamon
1 envelope plain gelatin
1/4 cup cold water
Cool Whip for topping

Mix together ingredients for 1st layer and press into 13x9 pan. Mix together ingredients for 2nd layer and pour over crust. Bake at 350°F for 20 minutes. Combine pumpkin, salt, milk, 1/2 cup sugar, egg yolks, and cinnamon from 3rd layer. Cook until mixture thickens slightly. Dissolve gelatin in 1/4 cup cold water. Add to mixture. Cool mixture completely (covered). After mixture has cooled, in separate bowl, beat 3 egg whites and remaining sugar until stiff. Fold in cooked mixture and pour over crust. Chill overnight. Top with Cool Whip when serving.
